Many die in avalanche disaster

For weeks Central Furope anxiously awaited its first snow. The snow that brings winter sports. The same snow that has now brought death and destruction to Blons - a little village in Western Austria. When news that two dreaded avalanches had completely engulfed this rushed village - rescue teams madmatamimaxay to the scene. And discrete They found over twenty houses submerged and many people missing. But halp was at hand. The American and Swift authorities organised delicopter and and supplies of all kinds were dropped by parachute. Back at Blons, the rescuers began the heart-breaking task of digging out the entombed villagers. And specially-trained dogs were used in the race against time.

Progress reports were radioed back to central control-points - and restoring requests, too, for more volunteers, digging-equipment, life-maxing stimulants - and medical supplies to comfort frozen survivors. As each house was uncovered - the tragic story was pieced together. The story of how thousands of tons of snow, released by the sudden rise in temperatures - had poured in on the hapless victims.

Cattle, too, have been saved from a frozen tomb and brought along trenches, dug in the snow, to safety.

Few of the survivors will forget those hours of terror as they waited for the welcome sounds of rescue operations.

Further avalanches had struck at Switzerland and Germany. **Description**, The deathroll in Austria alone - has run well into three figures. Still the work of rescue goes on. ^Helicopters bring in much-needed supplies - and fly out injured survivors for hospital treatment. S Two years ago, **kunizati** Austria suffered a similar catastrophe, Since then, a programme of defence works has been put into operation. This alone may have saved many lives in the country's worst avalanche disaster
