first seeds of the British Constitution were planted in Australia. And now comes the final link with Westminster, as the Queen axis axis axis opens a new session of the New South Wales Parliament, by making the traditional Speech from the Throne. SOUND.

So this "Mother Perliament of Australia" becomes the first in the country to be opened by a Reigning Sovereign. Fitting indeed, for from those vigorious mots, a healthy growth of legiblation spread across the young Continent.

And as the Queen and the Duke leave the Building, the cheers of greeting symbolise Australia's allegiance to the Crown and to the traditions of

Wearing a lime-green frock, with the Star and Ribbon of the Garter, the Queen told the company (drawn from every walk of life) that she felt very much at home among her Australian people SOUND.

Another strenuous day began with a Rally of 100,000 Exservicemen at the Anzac Memorial in Hyde Park. Here, a bouquet for the Queen was presented by a time Gueen, who then joined the Duke in a charming exchange of courtesies deroes of Gallipoli, Tobruk and New Guinea looked prouldy on, as the Queen and the Duke chatted to eight holders of the V.C. and the George Cross.
