So, with a Conference scheduled to write the final chapter of the Korean war, America's famous 45th Division reviewed at a farewell parade on the Peninsula by General Maxwell Taylor, 8th Army Commander.

There's a silver lining in the sky for these veterans. That goodbye salute means that they're bound for home.

Heroes of many gallant actions, the 45th is one of two Divisions being replaced by South Korean troops. So now their Korean story has a happy ending.

And there's a happy beginning to a new life for eighty-two refugees from Eastern Europe (among them many children and a Nun) arriving at Idlewild Airport, New York.

Among the group (which travelled under the care of a Committee for European migration) were many families whose search for freedom, over the people of Springfield, Illinois, (where Abraham Lincoln that early champion of personal liberty once lived) a new nationwide "freedom crusade" is launched.
