Paris: Arriving by air from Indo-China is Mme De Castris, wife of the General who commanded the garrison of Dien Bien Phu in its gallant stand against the Viet-Minh forces. Until her husband became one of 48,000 French prisoners in rebel hands, Mme de Castris worked in a hospital.
