America --- Thanks to ample warning by the weather bureau, New York and New England were ready for Hurricane Edna - the second storm to lash the Atlantic seaboard in twelve days

Torrential rain (the heaviest for 45 years) - quickly flooded the roads, while on the farmlands, crops were laid flat over a wide area.

Hundreds of trees, too, were levelled by the gale.

In Boston, small boats, which had been gamaged by the previous hurricane, were battered anew.

The wind-lashed rain brought nightmare conditions to the roads, many drivers being marconed in their cars.

One of the most publicised storms in hastory, "Edna" left a death-roll of seventeen, before blowing itself out in Canada.
