London-- Roman Temple unearthed--

London--- In the heart of the City, near the Mansion House, an ancient Roman temple (dating back to the second century A.D.) has been unearthed - the first of its kind ever discovered in the Capital.

A visitor to this ~~site~~^{relic} of Roman habitation in London was Sir David Eccles - Minister of Works. He was shown over the site by Mr W.F. Grimes - Director of the London Museum - in charge of excavations.

~~Unfortunately~~ Unfortunately for future generations, the site of the temple, with its beautifully preserved altar, well, and other ~~remains~~^{modern} remains, has been scheduled for a 14 storey block of offices.

But a marble head of the ~~Persian~~^{PAGAN} God Mithras and other relics may find a permanent home in the Guildhall Museum.
