London-- A sunny new world for schoolchildren is this Primary School at Paddington- specially designed, with the latest suntrap windows and corridors, to attract its 700 pupils.

Now over to Blackheath, for a glimpse of Kidbrooke School. This is the L.C.C.'s first comprehensive secondary school, which combines both a general and technical education under one roof.
