that gutted the upper floors of a huge rubber tyre factory. The biggest outbreak since the war, the City's entire fire brigade (assisted by a U.S. Air Force unit) fought the consuming flows.

A round-the-clock battle that finished we next morning with the blaze under control.

The cause of the fire is, as yet, uncertain; but the total damage has been estimated at around £300,000.

But there was happier news from Hangover - the return home by air - of thirty former German Prisoners-of-War from Russia...

A joyous moment the tinged with tears, as the men were re-united with their leved ones. For long years (the nine since the end of the war) they had lived on faith and hope. Now the great day was here, as they heard those few words of rich meaning: "Let's go home."
