For a year, Doug Wilkinson lived in this tiny settlement, enduring the hardships of a nomadic life in the Arctic.

The youngsters make their own fun - using caribou skins instead of sledges. The family home, of course, is the igloo - ~~made of frozen ice~~ - and the bare necessities of life depend almost entirely upon the skill of the hunter.

Besides the family, the huskies have to be fed. After the frozen seal-meat has been chopped up, the dogs "come and get it". A case of everyone for himself - the unwritten law of the Frozen North.

Sub-zero temperatures at Mount Washington, New Hampshire - where American G.I.'s are testing the Army's winter clothing under commando-style training conditions.

During the ~~tests~~ ^{trials}, constant checks are made to record the body temperatures of the men - while wearing specially-heated ~~knit~~ footwear. It's the old maxim - warm feet mean a warm body.
