Polio discovery

America honours Dr. Jonas Salk, whose brilliant research work as Pittsburg has led to the discovery of a new vaccine to prevent infantile paralysis.

The new vaccine was proved in tests involving two million children achieving some eighty-per-cent immunity.

U.S. Government approval for manufacture soon followed and a race against time to innoculate youngsters before the dreaded polio-season begins. The new vaccine is to be tested this year, in Britain. Queen with Australia league
