An ugly situation soon developed - and a large force of special police had their work cut out trying to restore order. The deadlock involved over nine thousand employees.

Earthquake in Greece

Greece: For the third time in a year, the plain of Thessaly was struck by a devastating earthquake - the Port of Volos (the fifth largest city) being the hardest hit.
