Some of Britain's first-line aircraft were "on parade" when King Hussein of Jordan paid an official visit to the R.A.F. Station, Biggin Hill. an experienced pilot) thoroughly this air-minded Monarch ( enjoyed a close-up view of the Hunters, Meteors and Canberras, before watching a flying display - arranged in his honour. During the show, Hunter fighters flew over in "H" formation, saluting the Royal onlooker. After various squadron demonstrations, a Land Canberra jet bomber displayed its rangered speed and manosuvrability. But to King Hussein, the highlight of the visit was a flight in a Vampire jet trainer ; though last November, to had flown in an R.A.F. Canberra, a six hundred miles per hour. Flying in a dual-control machine, to took over for most of the thirty minute flight - a thrilling experience for the only Reigning Monarch to have flown in a jet bomber.
