But not for long. Right from the start, Britain's World champion, Geoff Duke (No. 3) - raced out in front - shattering the lap record.

This was the fourth event in the nine-race World Championship series - and Geoff led all the way. A champion in a hurry to retain his world crown.

World champions in action, too, at the Paddington Recreation Ground - Reg Harris and Cyril Peacock - the cycle spring-champions of 1954.
