So - for the first time in living memory - the Royal Meeting opened in Mid-July, and summer graced the occasion - with the hottest day of the year picnic luncheons were taken early (before racing began) - and the on two-year-olds entered for the Nursery Stakes - one of the new emenities of the course.

Then the arrival of the Queen (accompanied by Princess Margaret) set the seal of the greatest week of racing in Turf history.

In the Paddock, Her Majesty had a word with jockey W.H. Carr - who was unplaced on her colt, Sierra Nevada in the St. Jeme's Palace Stakes....

Next race was the Ascot Stakes; but let's leave Romney Legend and the Parade and look at the fashions.

There's Lady Docker with Sir Bernard ..

At the tapes - a field of fifteen face the starter in this topeclass handicap for three year-olds and upwards...

And - away they go - galloping down the new straight mile - with two and a half miles to go ...

Past the stands for the first time - Crossmount is the willing pace-maker - leading from Palace Guard....Corydalis....and Manas....then comes the pack...

An unusual head-on view as they swing round into the finishing straight.-

And what a race it is.....First Romany Air/goes to the front....

Then Little Cloud, with Lester Piggott up, the takes over - mich four or
five - Prescription, Romney Legend, Wildnor and Manas all coming fest....
