'55. ernational Channel Swim--Variou many Nations from France -- Soon after dawn, twelve men and four women frankting mationaxxpreparedxferxies prepared, at Cap Gris Nez, for the annual mass Channel Swim, after several postponements due to unfavourable conditions. (3) covered in pounds of grease, they scrambled into the water, to kigh begin the world's toughest race- the long 21 miles to Dover, and the struggle with the tides. Soon the swimmers were well under way, with American Laurie Park as pasemaker, closely followed by Abdel The Aby Heig of Egypt. It was almost a neck-and-neck fight between them for the last four miles, Flying over the Channel in a helicopter 5. Hy Butlin wanted to see for himself who was winning his International Channel Swim, as they battled steadily nearer the English Coast. The White Cliffs of Dover in sight, at last, and an exuberant watky well-wisher joined the leader- the Toption Heif, who already holds the record for crossing from England to France. And it's victory for the 27 year-old Egyptian , as he clambered ashore at St Margaret's Bay. Only three out of 16 finished the race, and Heif (who was II hours, 44 minutes in the water) was given a great reception ashore. Billy Butlin, made the presentation of the I000 Guinea Silver Cup and £500 to Heif, shares shared the limelight with Laurie Park, who landed 17 minutes later FROM THE the White City - where, despite a rain-soaked track, Brian Hewson won a brilliant half-mile in the first International Match between Ingland Britain and Hungary, sponsored by the"News of the World". On this star-studded afternoon, Derek Ibbotson-(Britain's second string and Chris Chataway were leading in the last lap of the 3 Miles.

Suddehly Hungary's Tabori (British All-Comer's record holder) flashed wixeen between them. Exercic Chataway went after him at a terrific pace and took a two yard lead.
