Soon the swimmers were well under way, with American Laurie Park as
paseemaker, closely followed by Abdel ~~Abu~~ Heif of Egypt. It was
almost a neck-and-neck fight between them for the last four miles.

5.11y Butlin wanted to see for himself who was winning his International
Channel Swim, as they battled steadily nearer the English Coast.

The White Cliffs of Dover in sight, at last, and an exuberant ~~well~~
well-wisher joined the leader- ~~the Egyptian~~ Heif, who already
holds the record for crossing from England to France.

And it's victory for the 27 year-old Egyptian, as he clambered ashore
at St Margaret's Bay.

Only three out of 16 finished the race, and Heif (who was 11 hours,
44 minutes in the water) was given a great reception ashore.

Billy Butlin, ~~the~~ made the presentation of the 1000 Guinea Silver Cup
and £500 to Heif. ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ ^{He} shared the limelight with Laurie Park,
who landed 17½ minutes later.
