But for three drivers - the road was signposted with tragedy. Right from the start, Stirling Moss No. 10 (took the lead. To protected by wide ditches, race fans watched to thrilling duel

as a lone works Jaguar, driven by Mike Hawthorne met the challenge of the Mercedes team....

Then - early in the second lap - came disaster. An injured marshel is marks carried across the course for attention, and a burnt-out car makes the spot where seven cars piled up - the worst British racing disaster for years...

While the race continued, the tragic story slowly unfolded. How one car had crashed and burst into flames - and following cars plunged headlong into

merenwhile and the Mercedes team stated their mesposition. The 630 mile event.

Here - Stirling Moss comes in for repairs - arear tyre had thrown a tread. The wheel is changed in seconds...and the co-driver, John Fitch takes over - while Moss snatches a rest, before the final battle for supremacy.

Meanwhile, on a track made treacherous by rain - another crash had claimed a third victim....

Finally, with Hawthorns retiring through engine-trouble, Stirling Moss triumphed - at an average speed of 88.32 miles per hour.

The young speed king had celebrated his 26th birthday by gaining his third T.T. triumph - an all-time record.
