Russian Power station

Russia: Though atomic energy has now become an accepted wonder, ~~hydro~~ hydraulic power is often a more practical proposition. This is the case at remote ~~in~~ Irkutsk, on the Mongolian border, where a hydro-electric power station (the first of eight) is under construction. The plant will harness the swift-flowing waters of the Angara River and it is hoped to complete the project this year.

Monorail

Road Safety (over)

Continuing its road safety experiment, Slough invited the Minister of Transport to inaugurate a new Traffic Signal System.

In practical style, Mr Watkinson tested the system by pressing a cross-the-road button.
