

Memorial to Firemen Heroes

10th April 1956

Lambeth: Former comrades were remembered at the London Fire Brigade Headquarters, when the Archbishop of Canterbury came to dedicate a War Memorial that was unveiled by the <sup>Home</sup> Secretary of State, Major Lloyd George SOUND.

The Memorial ~~a striking hand-engraved brass tablet showing St. Paul's Cathedral, ringed by billowing flames~~ symbolises the courage and supreme devotion to duty of firemen and women during the Great Blitz on London in 1940-41...
