

Ten years ago, the first jet aircraft landed on a British carrier. Since then, changing Naval strategy has brought rapid progress. These are the first pictures of the D.H. 110 - the largest and most advanced all-weather fighter, (on order for the Royal Navy) - undergoing trials at sea ~~on~~ ^{with} H.M.S. Ark Royal - our most modern aircraft carrier.

Successful trials have also been carried out by the Supermarine N.113 Naval fighter - which, besides carrying atom bombs, will be used to launch guided missiles. (2)

In the Mediterranean, General Gruenther, the Supreme Allied Commander, Europe, has been perfecting another feature of post-war strategy - the co-ordination of Western ^{Naval} ~~Mar~~ strength.
