London: Royal enthusiasts at the International Horse Show, where the Queen and Princess Margaret were rewarded by one of the most thrilling jumping events since the war.

The King George the Fifth Gold Cup was at stake, and J. Lanni, on Huntsman the Sixth, incurred only four faults for the fourteen stiff fences.

Three times winner of the trophy, Colonel Llewellyn tries again on "Aherlow". But twelve faults put him out of the running.

And just to show that even top-class performers can have an off day - here's Ireland's Lt. Cullinan on Shannon Grove, amassing a 36-fault total.
