Naming Endeavour-

Southampton-- Already famous as an Antarctic survey vessel, the "John Biscoe" is commissioned for the Royal New Zealand Navy, and re-named "Endeavour" by Lady Webb- wife of New Zealand's High Commissioner.

The vessel will carry that country's section of the Commonwealth Expedition to the Antarctic, where they will link up with the British force- under Dr Fuchs.
