

Pipe-line

In Spain, the construction of American Air Bases brought one major problem. How to transport vast supplies of fuel over inadequate roads. The difficulty has now been overcome by the construction of a multi-channel pipe-line - stretching 485 miles from the Roza Naval Base - to the interior.

Complete with pumping stations and storage tanks, the pipe-line can carry various grades of fuel at the same time . will be completed early next year.
