

The annual service of Remembrance at the Cenotaph in London's Whitehall is charged this year with more urgent meaning than ever before --- as Sir Anthony Eden, (Prime Minister and ~~the~~ head of the Government) and Mr Gaitskell, (Leader of the Opposition) and the chiefs of the <sup>THREE</sup> ~~services~~ services, take their places and await the arrival of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth.

At other places within the United Kingdom --- throughout the British Commonwealth of Nations, and in many other lands beside --- this solemn hour on the Day of Remembrance recalls vividly to mind the heavy price that has been paid in this tragic century.

Flanders poppies raise their heads in the Field of Remembrance--- spanning the years of sacrifice from Mons to Cyprus.

At the foot of the Cenotaph --- Her Majesty the Queen lays the first wreath.

And the parade marches away to the old, familiar tunes.

From London --- to the Austrian frontier where <sup>AT THE SAME TIME</sup> refugees from Hungary continue to stream across the border. Since they have left, the active rising has been all but crushed. But its place has been taken by the passive resistance of a general strike; and the dread shadow of starvation marches grimly forward.

At the same time --- in the Red Square in Moscow --- this parade celebrates the thirty-ninth anniversary of the revolution in Russia --- replacing the reign of the Czars with the rule of the Soviet dictators.

After the armed forces --- a procession of workers, some of ~~whom~~ <sup>are</sup> whom ~~whom~~ carrying banners in support of Egypt.

And in Paris --- members of the French Communist Party hold a demonstration. It is a retaliation for the anti-Communist demonstration which had taken place on the previous day, against Russia's action against the people of Hungary.

Now --- Germany. The changing phases of a world in turmoil bring us to a scene in Neubiberg, where aircraft of the United States bring in hundreds of tons of supplies --- to be ~~strictly~~ used by the International Red Cross in Hungary. ~~The nations of the eastern world have acted swiftly and generously to send help to that stricken land of Eastern Europe.~~

Also in Germany --- a strange side-issue of a nation's struggle reveals itself in <sup>THE</sup> arrival of the Hungarian football-team <sup>WEARING</sup> --- who <sup>BLACK ARMLETS THEY</sup> were sent from Budapest during a lull in the fighting <sup>to play their ~~own~~ international match ~~at Neubiberg~~.</sup>

Now --- south to Egypt.....where our camera, flying over Port Said reveals that all is now quiet at this town of entry into the Suez Canal.

Once again the shops are open and it's business as usual. With order restored, British troops give out food and other necessities among the needy. After the fighting there was a temporary shortage; but a free distribution was made following the arrival of an Anglo-French relief ship.

At this time an international Red Cross convoy was all ready to go in to the relief of suffering in Hungary. But for many days its entry was forbidden by the Russian authorities.

Back in Egypt, the Allied troops are camping alongside the Suez Canal --- having halted their advance at the moment of the ~~agreed~~ agreed cease fire. <sup>^</sup> Across a strip of sand --- quite close --- are the troops of Colonel Nasser. <sup>^</sup>

Back home from Egypt --- are the men who were wounded while the battle was ~~being~~ being fought. Happily, they are but few. As we bid them welcome home again, our thoughts turn to those others who have laid down their lives; and though their numbers are mercifully fewer still, they join the great company that we shall always remember.

Here are some of the troops of the United Nations ~~assembled~~  
at what is called the staging area --- in Naples. An advance  
guard of the emergency police force to be sent to Egypt --- with the  
backing of UNO. A small force as yet --- ~~little more than a token~~.  
But let's hope it is the beginning of a United Nations Assembly  
with authority --- and power. ^

This is their commanding officer, the Canadian General Burns.  
We wish him well --- in a task that bristles with problems.
