England V Yugoslavia

At Wembley, seventy thousand fans applauded the warming note of goodwill and friendship that introduced the fourth soccer international between England and Yugoslavia.

Despite that Scottish defeat, Hugoslavia kicked off in confident mood But white-shirted England were determined to gain that first wietory over the visitors - so the agile Bears was soon in action. Then (after the skill of Finney and Matthews had paved the way) Haynes sent the other were Brooks racing through to score. Another Wembley injury. Haynes is carried off by the sporting Bears. But, this time, substitutes were allowed.

The second half. Yugoslavia still brilliant in mid-field. But England supplied the goal-punch. A substitute Tommy Taylor smashes home goal number two

Meanwhile, maestro Stan Matthews was a marked man in more ways than one: A penalty!

Roger Byrne takes the kick. And a wonder ful save by Beara. In the closing minutes, the Wembley floodlights did little to relieve the gathering gloom for Yugoslavia. Stan Matthews laid on another goal for Taylor. In Athree-nothing victory for England.
