## East Germany

East Germany: The full circle has turned. A legacy of German militarism marched in welcome - when Mr Khruschev, the Soviet Communist leader, arrived in East Berlin.

One visitor, a Nigerian, revealed the complete breakdown of security arrangements, when he insisted upon handing Mr Khruschev a letter of thanks. - He had just been granted permission to travel though the Soviet Union.
