

Congratulations and good wishes to Queen Elizabeth and Prince
Philip as they celebrate the tenth anniversary of their wedding.

And let us now look back --- as in a family album --- to this
happy group that smiled at our newsreel cameras at the
announcement of xhairxargagagagax the engagement of our young
Princess Elizabeth; and to the splendour of the wedding ceremony
at Westminster Abbey in November 1947

The streets of London were packed with excited, cheering crowds as the bridal coach, with Princess Elizabeth and her bridegroom --- newly-created Dike of Edinburgh --- drove from the Abbey to Buckingham Palace

The Princess's bridal gown --- a lovely creation encrusted with pearls --- was described at the time as "something out of a fairy tale".

It was the forerunner of many beautiful dresses

But soon after the wedding, Princess Elizabeth and the Duke set the pattern of service to the Commonwealth that they have followed ever since. This was their first tour of Canada

In 1952, by the death of her father, King George VI, the Princess was crowned Queen, in the Abbey in which she had zakahzata celebrated her wedding

These were scenes that will never be forgotten by any who saw them

Then began the familiar round of a Sovereign's duties --Trooping the Colour

And the ceremonies of installation of the Knights of the Garter.

And even on holiday --- as well as relaxation with the family at Balmors, the young Queen found time to spare for royal duties; such as lending a hadd at this local sale of work on Deeside.

A sign of the rapid passing of time was this occasion when Prince Charles --- at eight years old --- was taken for his first term to his first boarding school
