The news of the King's visit to North Africa came as a stimulating surprise to everyone. Accompanied by Admiral Cunningham and other high-ranking Naval Officers, we see His Najesty during his all-embracing tour. Soon after his arrival, he attended Divine Service in a Naval Canteen.

An early visit was to an Army Rest Camp on the shores of the Mediterranean. Here His Majesty spant some time with me. of the lat and Sth Armies. The King's presence in Horth Africa at that time had a tonic effect in the fullest sense of the word.
