MOSCOW CONFERENCE,

The arrival at Moscow airport of the American Secretary of State, Mr. Cordell Hull, and his party for the Moscow Conference. The introductory scenes which took place on the eve of the historic assembly in the Soviet Capital, where the Foreign Ministers of Britain, America and Russia concluded far-reaching decisions for the successful prosecution of the war and the hastening of victory.

The second plane to touch down brings the British Foreign Minister, Mr. Anthony Eden. The start of twelve days of intensive discussion which were to terminate in complete agreement on all points. Three-power unity which surpassed the most optimistic hopes.

Then comes a short Military spectacle of Russian Guardsmen in a ceremonial march past.

The flags of the three nations seen at the Airport also form the centre piece at the Conference Table. The seal is set to a declaration which is a joint guarantee of future agreement. The document, built on a basis of goodwill, receives the signature of M. Molotov.

Mr. Cordell Hull (whom Mr. Churchill referred to as that gallant old eagle) appends his signature, and the document is then passed to Mr. Eden. The three nations will not permit anything to impede the process of joint action which alone can accelerate the end of the war and start them on the road to the great day of post-war reconstruction.

Mr. Eden lays emphasis on the cordial atmosphere which existed at all times. We can see that for ourselves in these pictures which the Foreign Minister himself brought back from Moscow.

After flying from Africa, Mr. Eden reached Paddington to receive a warm and excited welcome. We had been prepared for his good news, but now we knew that it would not be long before he revealed details of this inter-allied accomplishment. Everyone on the platform was waiting to offer congratulations. M. Gusev, the Soviet Ambassador, was obviously pleased.

Our microphone was capturing some of the Foreign Minister's words.

In the sphere of strategy, we may expect to learn of the decisions arrived at, by the fresh blows that will be struck at German power in the coming months.
