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CHINESE IN BURMA.

In the jungles of Northern Burma, newly-trained and equipped Chinese soldiers take up new positions across the Salween river. Seldom seen pictures of our far Eastern Ally assisting in the Burma campaign.

General Stilwell knows well the wilderness in which he fights. Every step forward is an expedition into the unknown. They plunge into the choking undergrowth. Trees are blasted to show the path of penetration. Men may easily be swallowed up and lost in the dense tangle of the junc primeval forests. Advance units are constantly in contact with Japanese Patrols.

Many a swift flowing stream may be crossed only by a rattan-cane bridge. Flimsy structures which have to carry men and material over a difficult and dangerous barrier in their slow advance. Back over the jungle tracks come the wounded.

Chinese Troops, equipped with Allied weapons and vehicles push through roads still muddy from the rains of the monsoon season.

This war front will some day claim the headlines again.
