NORMANDIE SAILS AGAIN.

Not as lively to look at as she used to be, but there she is, the reflected NORMANDIE once again on an even keel. The 83,000 ton liner, now the U.S.S. LAFAYETTE is taken from her Hudson River berth for the first time in more than 4 years... crowding with success the greatest salvage job on record. A fleet of tugs, puffing like so many bulldogs, pushing and hauling the fire-gutted hulk into the deeper channel waters of the river.

Still showing scars of the inferno that raged within her when she took her reb1 into the maddy bottom of the river, she resembles some huge derelict returning from a watery grave. The cost of salvage up to date is a million pounds. Another five million will have to be spent for refitting. Then, inducted into war duty for the duration, the U.S.S. LAFAYETTE will be on tholist of famous ships on Active Service.
