**THE TROUBLE IN LEBANON.**

Without entering into the whys and wherefores - the pros and cons - of the trouble in Lebanon, we offer these pictures of recent incidents in Beirut, the Capital.... When the French Authorities in Lebanon arrested President BECHARI EL KHOURY and his Cabinet Ministers, the people revolted and demonstrations were the order of the day. The British and American Governments were disturbed at the turn of affairs and the situation became, hourly, more acute.

The atmosphere became calmer as the attitude of the British became known, and much relief was felt all round when the British Minister-of-State-Resident-in - the-Middle-East, Mr. R.G. Casey, arrived in Beirut for consultations with Sir Edward Spears the British Minister in Lebanon.

Only a few hours before these pictures of Sir Edward Spears were taken, French troops had clashed with a Lebanon Crowd and there were some casualties...A most regrettable affair, described by General Catroux as "a painful misunderstanding". Anyway, the President and his Ministers are now released and back in office, and the latest word we have is that "normal life has been resumed".
