LINKING WITH 'MORE CANADIANS ARRIVE IN ITALY.

Another landing of significance takes place at Casablanca.

Some seventeen-hundred you fugitives from German-occupied France, 'breathe again' as they arrive in Morocco. Most of them have suffered years of hardships, and latterly have been incarcerated in General Franco's prisons in Spain.

On the Quay to meet the refugees is General Garnet, commanding the Casablanca Division. For so long have these Frenchmen been restricted in their activities that the sight of the tricolor gives them the feeling of coming home.

The French Red Cross has organized a buffet and they see to it that every one has something to keep him going, for they have yet to weather the official reception. This is voiced by General Garnet who welcomes them back to the freedom which, one day, will be the blessing of all Frenchmen.
