AMERICA'S THANKSGIVING DAY IN BRITAIN.

The Union Jack and the Stars and Stripes fly side by side over Westminster Abbey on Thanksgiving Day. For the second time the Abbey had been given over to our American Allies for the celebration of this outstanding day in their calendar. Dating back to the observance set by the Pilgrim Fathers in Thanksgiving for their first harvest, the annual festival is a hallowed occasion. The President's Proclamation was read during the day by Admiral Stark, U.S. Naval Chief in Europe.

Boston, Lincolnshire, has a more than intimate interest in Thanksgiving Day. To many Americans it is their hereditary home town. What more natural than that it should see the assembling of your Americans in the beautiful old church of St. Botolph's, whose tower is known as the Boston Stump.
