VICEROY PRESENTS V.C. 'S.

India's third V.C. presentation Parade of the war is held outside the historic walls of Delhi's Red Fort. Troops on parade include a unit of the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry and the 6th Rajputana Rifles.

The widew and son of Company Havildar-Major Cheelu Ram posthumously awarded the V.C. for conspicuous bravery,

The Viceroy, Viscount Wavell, presents the medal. The widew of Cheelu Ram wears the traditional erange ranks cleak of Rajputana women.

Jemedar Gaje Chale of the 5th Royal Gurkha Rifles, is the other recipient of the Empire's highest Military honour. Stories of outstanding gallantry in Burma and Tunisia are recalled by this ceremony.
