INTERNATIONAL FOOTBALL AT GLASGOW.

The biggest sporting crowd of the war, 133,000 at Hampden Park, Glasgow. For the second time in two months, General Montgomery attends an England-Scotland International. For Scotland the memory of their six-goals-to-two defeat at Wembley had to be wiped out. The visitors were up against a solid team, backed by the nerve shattering war cry of Scottish football fans known as the Hampden roar. The combination put England on the defensive for a while.
