THE WAR IN THE SOUTH PACIFIC.

General MacArthur and Admiral Nimitz cook up another pot of hot water for the Japs - - - planning the campaign which brought final defeat to the enemy in the Solomons. At Bougainville, theory is put into practice as Allied dive bombers drop their loads only a few yards from the leading edge of the attacking force. Seasoned American Troops are employed against a Japanese division, responsible in their grim history, for the rape of Nanking. Though much has happened in the South Pacific since these pictures were taken, by their proximity to the nightmare of jungle fighting, they show in all their grim reality how hard won was the victory.
