- 3, M.S. A lifeboat containing crew members is picked up. 14
- 4, V.S. At testing range in America the soldiers fire phosphorous bombs from a mortar gun. The bombs land and give off large spray of white phosphorous. 26
- 5, V.S. Demonstration of flame throwers in action, 38
- 6, V.S. Medium bombers making runs over dropping area and a demonstration of the various kind of bombs the Americans are making. 45
