Canada comes off the meat ration as beef production breaks all records. On Alberta's vast Western plains, thousands of Herefords are rounded up. Most of the cattle have seen men only a few times in their lives, and stampedes are always a possibility. Even so, five men can easily handle fourteen hundred head of cattle. At least they say its easy.
