

THE FLYING BOMB.

The Prime Minister accompanied by Mrs. Churchill visits Anti-Aircraft gun sites which are tasking flying bombs. He wears the uniform of Colonel of the Royal Sussex Regiment, moving from Battery to Battery and hearing the scores recorded by gun crews.
