THE FALL OF TARNOPOL First Pictures Crom Russia.

The City of Tarnopol, a regional centre of the Ukraine, was liberated by the Red Army in mid-April. While all serts of problems, including transport from Russia, delayed the screening of the pictures of this brilliant success, it is with unstinted admiration for the Russian armies that we bring you the story of Tarnopol's deliverance from the Germans. It was troops of Harshal Zhukov's First Ukranian Army who captured this city in Southern Peland. The Germans called it "the Gateway to Germany". Wonder what names they're giving now to towns on the borders of Prassia.

For two weeks, fighting went on in the streets and houses of this town well inside the former Polish berder.

With the exception of some two thousand Germans taken prisoner, the Garrison of 16,000 men was wiped out. Vicious house 'to house combat manual ensued for days on end.

According to a Moscow report, the Germans reserted to strange methods to belster up the morake of their troops in TARNOPOL. Cases full of Tron Crosses were dropped by parachate.

Germans helding out in stone houses transformed into block-houses, are decimated by grenades.

We know the name of that soldier on the balcony: its private Federenko, first man to enter the bailding and reach the second floor. Each storey and room had to be wen by stages.

Marshal ZHUKOV'S victorious troops complete the occupation of the term and battered city. Another place laid waste; another name to add to the long list of ruined towns of Europe. Remants of the German garrisen sit in solmen silence, looking out on the rifles of the guards and reflecting on their prospects. The Herrenvolk look glam.

The roads are lined with grey green columns trudging towards captivity.

Russian victory at TARMOPOL called forth high praise from the United Nations. The sweeping successes in the North today are nothing short of miraculous. The ring is cleating in on Germany, and Prussia, the spawning ground of German militarism, is invasion point Number One.
