GENERAL DE GAULLE IN WASHINGTON.

An elaborate welcome awaits General de Gaulle as his plane flying direct from Algiers arrives at Washington National airport. He is received with full honours due to him as head of the French Army -- a salute of guns, a guard of honour, high ranking American Service chiefs to greet him, and an Army Air Force Band to play the French National Anthem.

General de Gaulle is escorted from the airfield by the President's Military and Naval Aide de Camps.

At the White House President Roosevelt receives the General in the diplomatic Reception Room. As a leading Washington newspaper puts it: "America welcomes General de Gaulle as a man who, (while most French leaders were digging the grave of their country), was raising the standard of revolt."
