V 1 SITES.

As the victorious Allied armies engulf Hitler's Flying bomb coast, more and more of his launching places are falling into our hands. These rail-tracks are part of a site captured near Rouen. On a map of England are marked the big towns which the Nazis hoped to destroy with their VL. In block houses, equipment and personnel sought to escape the R.A.F., but there are plenty of signs of the havoe our bombers caused.
