LANCASTERS LET IN THE SEA

Within a few days of the attack on the Kembs Dam on the Rhine, R.A.F. Bomber Command sent its Lancasters in an assault on the heavy gun positions on the Dutch island of Walcheren.

This attack is an integral part of the close air support which is being given to the Canadian Army in this sector, engaged in some of the toughest fighting since "D"-Day. Lancasters also bombed and burst the dyke near Veere to let the sea in on the Germans.

The German Guns, which were the object of the attack, were menacing the advance of the Canadians....so Bomber Command went out and silenced them.
