DNIEPER DAM RESTORED

The DNIEPROSTROI dam at ZAPOROZHE, show-piece of the Soviet Union and biggest of its kind in the world, fell to the Germans in the Autumn of 1941. At least the shell of it did. For the great water barrier was blown up before the Red Army left. Reconstruction is carried out at the famous Russian tempo. Workers get down to the task of restoring this ferro-concrete masterpiece with the American-built power-station on which the surrounding cities depend for their electricity.

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Here is power. The irresistible sweep of the peaned-up waters of the Daieper may well symbolise the Red Army's massive push into the Reich.
