CAPTIVES COURAGEOUS

With traly amazing obserfulness and fortitude, newly freed Canadian soldiers march out of the Reich on the first stage of their journey home. Taken prisoner at the famous Dieppe raid the long months of captivity in German hands failed to break their splendid morale. The American Third Armoured Division opened up the barbed wire eage at Duderstad. The British, American and Russian prisoners freed there had been marched 900 kilometres from Eastern Germany.

Coldstream Guardsmen released three hundred and fifty more
Allied priseners from a Stalag north of Kingen. Among the
priseners were six Irish Guardsmen as well as French, Polish,
Grech and Jugoslav soldiers. Now here are the most damning pictures
of all. These are British soldiers and this is hew they looked
after 4 years in a stalag. They were force-marched on a starvation
diet away from the advancing Allied Amdes. Ten stone men
weighed about 80 pounds by the time the Germans had done with them.

Once back in Britain, released prisoners take a few days to get used to a square meal again. Even Naafi tea tastes good after ersatz alop.
