Wrecked V.2. rockets, rooted out of their forest hide-out, mark the defeat of this terror weapon, Hitler's last fling at Britain. These are the ones that didn't reach the address on the label. V.2's killed or injured more than 9,000 people in London, East Anglia and the southern counties. Now, abandoned fuel tanks and mobile launching vehicles are a reminder of the war's deadliest weapon. One thousand and fifty V.2's were fired across the North Sea at England. In the trail of damage they left was the Chelsea Hospital, hit in January.

This is what a V.2 did to Straud Green, London, also in January. Scene of another V.2 incident was Smithfield Market. Here the camera caught a man whose job is now done, London's Regional Commissioner, Admiral Evans of the Broke. As Mr. Churchill said, "V.2 is finished thanks to the R.A.F. and the British Army."
