Quiet opening to the world's greatest crime story. The Allied War Crimes Commission begins its sittings in London. Lord Wright, the chairman, opened the proceedings. This is the first time newsreel cameras have been allowed inside the Law Courts. Contrast this orderly procedure with the macabre scenes in Milan where the bodies of Benito Mussolini, his Fascist accomplices and his mistress, Clara Petacci, were kicked and spat upon by a seething crowd. From Milan, Mussolini began the "March on Rome" which lifted him to power. In the same city, his story ended in this frenzied crescendo of hate and degradation, his body hanging from the roof of a petrol station.]

Vidkun Quisling, first of the breed of traitors who sold their countries to the Nazis, begins the legal battle for his life. At a Police Court hearing in Oslo, the man whose name has become a word of infamy in Europe's dictionaries, was remanded for trial by a special court. The woman who claims to be the wife of William Joyce. She was arrested with Lord Haw-Haw at Flensburg. It is alleged that she also made broadcasts in English over the Nazi radio. She is being held for full investigation. Joyce himself, shot through the buttocks arrives at a British Military Hospital near Lunenburg. British soldiers get a look at the one-time "Blackshirt" who used to come over the air with his sneering "Jairmany Calling."

Note the closed eyelids and then watch for the aly glances as he passes down the lines of contemptuous toadies.

If British fighting men in Lunenburg Hospital notice a bad smell somewhere around, they'll guess what it is. Captured German one-man submarines are under inspection near Copenhagen.
