THE MOZZIE & THE SQUIRT

A Mosquito with a new and bigger sting. A sixpounder gun, slung under the aircraft's four machine guns, made the Mozzie one of the war's most effective U-boat killers. First operational use of the sixpounder carrying aircraft was in November 1943. After that they became the U-boat's nightmare, scoring kill after kill before and after D-day. In one air battle, a Mozzie drew a bead on a big Junkers at a mile range and blew it out of the sky with one shell.

Another British war-winning plane is the jet-propelled Gloster Meteor - first squirt fighter of the United Nations to go into action against the enemy. For speed and manoevrability, R.A.F. pilots swear by the "Meteor." These squirt fighters won their spurs in the battle against the flying bomb.

Said an R.A.F. fighter-pilot after his first flight in a "squirt," "They're sweet to handle at high speed. It's just like driving around noiselessly on a cloud."

A people's thanks to the R.A.F. was made in Copenhagen. A big air display and march past by R.A.F. Units was a gala day for the Danish Capital.

Men of the R.A.F. Regiment paraded before the Queen of Denmark. A bugle band of the Waafs provided background music, and later they had a blow-out all on their own.
