Justice on the British model is given to those who had other ideas of how prisoners should be treated. The Belsen War Griminals arrive at Luneburg for trial. Their faces give little clue to what they're thinking Last out of the lerry is Josef Kramer, the beast of Belsen. The calm orderliness of the scene contrasts violently with the ghastly pictures which shocked the country when they were shown in British newsreels. Our cameraman Kenneth Gorden covers the opening scenes of the trial.

Kramer's chief woman assistant, Irma Grese wears the ourls.

Maj. General Berney-Ficklin presides over the court and the prisoners have been provided with Allied officers as defence counsel. Each prisoner wears a number for identification purposes, though the cards were taken off at a later stage of the trial.

Next to Kramer sits Dr. Frits Elein, German medical officer at Belsen - a man with a leaded conscience. Chief sadist among the wamen, Irma Grese, number nine, salked her way impassively through the leng tale of herror.

After 12 years of Maxi thuggery one wonders what the German's think of British justice. They may well mistake fairness for weakness?
